

#### Uncle Joe Lee's Jiao Tze Recipe

1 1/4 lbs. Ground pork

6 medium dried mushrooms, soaked

1/3 cup chopped green onions

2 eggs

6 oz. can diced water chestnuts

2 Tbsp. minced garlic

3 Tbsp. soy sauce

4 tsp. sesame oil

1 tsp. cornstarch

1 tsp. Accent

1/4 tsp. Black pepper

1 package potsticker wrappers, appx. 50

Small bowl of water

Large non-stick skillet

Vegetable oil

Editor in Chief: Deb Lin-Dyken Chop mushrooms and chestnuts to 1/3 cm. pieces. Add ingredients in a large bowl and mix thoroughly. Enjoy the heavenly aroma of this filling mixture! Put a wrapper in the palm of your hand, place 1 tsp. of the filling in the middle of the wrapper and use a finger to dab water along the outside circumference of the wrapper. Fold the wrapper in half and press, so that the opposite edges stick together. The edges may be fluted 3-4 times. After all the wrappers are filled, pour enough vegetable oil into the skillet to cover the surface. Under medium heat, pack the filled wrappers into the skillet in a circular pattern. The skillet should be large enough to hold all 50-60 wrappers. After ~20 minutes, the bottom of the dumplings should be turning brown. Add 1/3 cup water and cover the skillet. Cook until the water has evaporated (~15

Use a spatula to transfer the dumplings onto a plate covered with a paper towel (to capture the oil). Time for a tasty treat!

minutes).

⅓ cup soy sauce

¼ cup water

¼ cup vinegar

1 tsp. Sesame oil

¼ tsp. Black pepper

½ tsp. Ground mustard

½ tsp. Garlic powder
